

Project Management: Course Plan (Draft ver2.2)

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1 OUTLINE OF THE LECTURE COURSE

The primary goal of this course is to understand the method of proposing a project, organizing a research group, and managing the project, through studying the basic knowledge about “a project,” which is based on a global standard of project management.

Students who complete this course will have an improved ability to design and implement a project properly. Students can design a research proposal by themselves at the end of this course. Attendance and active contribution to the class are expected in this course.

2 COURSE OBJECTIVES

There are three following objectives in this course. Students are expected to

- (1) To understand a project and project management comprehensively;
- (2) To acquire skills how to come up with a proposal for good research and how to develop a good idea into a research project; and
- (3) To acquire skills to find an interesting topic and issues related to their own research to present.

3 COURSE MATERIALS / SUPPLEMENTS

Handouts and materials will be provided in the class.

Recommended books, materials, movies, and other artworks will be introduced in this course. Students are expected to read and watch these materials to understand a method of project management and related issues further.
