ABSUTRACT

It is rare for software developed by Japanese people to be widely used overseas. Is this because Japanese people lack international software development capabilities, or is there another reason?

In this lecture, the developer of the open-source programming language Ruby, which is used worldwide, will introduce the "mind traps" that software developers are prone to and how to overcome them based on his own experience.



※About Ruby

Ruby is the object-oriented scripting language that Mr. Yukihiro Matsumoto has been developing since 1993. It has full-fledged object-oriented features and focusing programmer happiness. Ruby has gained high reputation not only in Japan but also overseas. In recent years, along with the epidemic of "Ruby on Rails" which was developed and presented by Mr. David Heinemeier Hansson in 2004. It is widely used in the field of web applications, and expected to be more popular all over the world in the future.

The creator of the Ruby programming language.

Mr. MATSUMOTO graduated from the University of Tsukuba with a B.S. in computer science in 1990. He served as a missionary of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Satins for 2 years while he was in the university.
